Throughout his career, he has worked as Assistant Director on more than 20 feature films, including "Pepe," which won the Silver Bear for Best Director at the 74th Berlinale for Nelson Carlo de los Santos Arias. Recently, he played the lead role in the new film by directors Laura Amelia Guzmán and Israel Cárdenas, "Interior Apartment Day." With "Maguana Racing," his first feature film in development, he has been selected for the prestigious Locarno Festival Residency, Recién Paridos (AECID, Ibermedia, UNESCO ACERCA), Extremadura Film Residency (NextGenerationEU), and the Co-production Event in the Industry Zone of the Ibero-American Film Festival of Huelva.

A graduate in Cinematography, with a focus on Lighting and Camera, from the Foundation University of Cinema (FUC) in Buenos Aires, Argentina. His debut as a director, the non-fiction feature film Morena(s), co-directed with Victoria Apolinario, is currently in the distribution stage. Morena(s) participated in the Work in Progress Documentary of the MAFIZ Industry Zone at the Málaga Film Festival in 2020, in the official competition selection at FIDBA 9 2021-2022, in the Official Opera Prima Documentary Competition at the Santo Domingo Global Film Festival, won the Best Documentary Feature award at the New York Latino Film Festival 2022, and was nominated for Best Documentary at the La Silla Awards 2022. After its festival circuit, Morena(s) had its national cinema release on January 18, 2024.

Iván has begun the development stage of his second documentary feature titled Negro, which has been selected for the annual Eurodoc 24 program and the MiradasDoc, MiradasAfro project incubator. He is also developing his first fiction feature, A Funeral for Lola, which was selected to be part of the Open Doors Project Hub program at this year's Locarno Film Festival.

Iván is committed to building a career in which he shares moving personal stories that also reflect the complexities and issues of the society and city in which he was born, through the creation and promotion of a national film industry that is not afraid to make social and political statements.

Two years into his bachelor's degree in business, José María began working at Centro León, an important cultural center in his hometown. There, he gained experience in cultural projects that led him to a career in the film industry. His thesis, titled "Market Analysis of the Dominican Film Industry based on Law 108-10," explored the country's growth in producing national films and providing production services since the law's implementation.

After working in numerous local films in the production department, he had the opportunity to enter the market of international productions that choose the Dominican Republic as their main location. He worked on films like Paramount's "The Lost City of D" (2021), Netflix Korea's "Narco-Saints" (2021), and ABC-Disney's "Saint-X" (2022).

Following these experiences, he met Francisco Valdez, an experienced local director and director of photography. This partnership resulted in José María's debut as a producer in the film "El Trayecto." Currently, the production is in the distribution stage and expects a national theatrical release in 2024.

Subsequently, he worked as a co-producer and location manager on the feature film "Bajo el Mismo Sol," the second movie by Ulises Porra and Ulla Prida, creators of "Carajita" (2021). "Bajo el Mismo Sol" was part of San Sebastian's Europe-Latin America Co-production Forum. Currently, he is producing his second feature film titled "A Marte." Additionally, he is part of the Project Hub program at the Locarno Festival with the project "Un Funeral Para Lola." José María looks forward to new productions; the Dominican Republic is full of great storytellers and compelling stories that need to be shared with the world.

Actor and lawyer. He began his studies in the children's Fine Arts workshops and received three years of specialised technical training at the National School of Dramatic Arts in the Dominican Republic. From 2000 to 2005, he was an actor at the Cocuyo Theater; from 2005 to date, he has worked as an actor at the National Theater Company.

His versatility is evident in his extensive portfolio, which includes more than 50 plays presented nationally and internationally, such as Rosa, Yago, and Roberto Suco. In addition to his stage work, he has lent his talent to radio commercials, TV series, and programs, as well as more than 20 films, short films, and feature films, such as Rafaela, Carpinteros, Rubirosa, Mis Quinientos Locos, and Freddy.

In 2012, his talent was recognised with the prestigious National Youth Award. His international acclaim continued to grow, leading to his first nomination for the Platino Awards in 2023. His performance in the film Rafaela earned him a nomination for the Soberano Awards as the best film actor in 2022, and he clinched the award for best actor at Premios La Silla in 2023.
